The chemical law **Chemicals (Management and Safety) Rules** 20xx (ICMSR) is on hold. Once it comes into force, the ICMSR will regulate Substances, Substances in Mixture, Substance in Articles, and Intermediates that are manufactured, imported, or placed in the Indian Territory. Notification and registration of substances are required. This report gives a summary on news updates on India in 2022.

## Key news from 2022

### Indian Standards

Since 2018, 63 chemicals have been added to the BIS compulsory list. Out of these 63 chemicals, 25 have been implemented. In 2023, 38 chemicals will be implemented according to various deadlines. Some of them are delayed from year 2022 due to COVID-19 restrictions. The announcement comes under the Quality Control Orders (QCOs).

Once the chemicals are included in the BIS list, manufacturers, traders, and importers will need BIS certification to be permitted to operate and they must carry the relevant BIS standards specification mark on the packaging and labels of their products. <u>Read more.</u>

# 58 Chemicals considered to be added to BIS list

58 chemicals that are regulated under the Rotterdam Convention are considered to be added to the BIS compulsory list. Since 2018, 63 chemicals have been added to the BIS Scheme I or the compulsory list.

Out of these 63 chemicals, 25 have been implemented. In 2023, 38 chemicals will be implemented according to various deadlines. Once the chemicals are included in the BIS list, manufacturers, traders, and importers will need BIS certification to be permitted to operate and they must carry the relevant BIS standards specification mark on the packaging and labels of their products.

#### 93 Chemical related products that may require compulsory certification

The Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) proposed a list with a total of 93 chemical products that are under consideration for compulsory certification in a Stakeholders Consultation Meeting with industry associations and manufacturers of Chem-ical products in December 2022.

### E-Waste (Management) Rules

The draft E-Waste (Management) Rules were published in the Gazette of India on 20 May 2022. The Rules will replace the current E-Waste (Management) Rules 2016 and is expected to come into force on 1 April 2023.

The Rules provide a legal basis for reduction of hazardous the chemicals used in a wide range of electrical and electronic equipment (EEE). The rules will affect manufacturers, producers, refurbishers, dismantlers, and recyclers. Entities must register on the portal and no entity can carry business without registration.

## Battery Waste Management Rules

The Indian Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change published the Battery Waste Management Rule, 2022, replacing the Batteries (Management and Handling) Rules, 2001.

The rules cover all types of batteries such as electric vehicle batteries, portable batteries, automotive batteries, and industrial batteries.

#### New Policy for Medical Devices

The Department of Pharmaceuticals (DoP) released the latest draft of the National Policy for medical devices for public consultation. It proposes regulations to ease patent processes, streamline regulatory clearances, and establish a single-window clearance system for the licensing of medical devices.

#### Plastic Waste Management Rules amended

The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change published the Plastic Waste Management (Amendment) Rules, amending the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016, in February 2022. The Rules affect importers, brand owners and plastic waste processors. Companies have to register in the centralized portal developed by the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB). According to the new Rules, single-use plastic items are prohibited from 1 July 2022.
